SUMMARY OF RESEARCH PROGRAM

My research focuses on fostering human well-being through work in adult education, on health, and for the environment. For the past 22 years, I have conducted research with underserved and marginalized communities in Japan and Southeast Asia, and with Southeast Asians in the U.S., to improve community-level and systems-level conditions. My main role working with nongovernmental organizations, governmental organizations and businesses has been to assist partners in building their capacity to plan projects and to assess the impact of their work. This kind of partnership research is labor-intensive and highly rewarding.

Current research project

“Exploring Young People’s ‘Eco’ Way of Life in Japan and Thailand: a Comparative Study of Emerging Grassroots Health Promotion”

Japan is facing a rising burden of lifestyle diseases and environmental contamination. As national and local governments grapple with these issues, young people appear to be creating their own subculture of health and sustainability – an “eco” way of life. Thailand faces similar problems and new eco trends. In this collaborative anthropological study, I lived in a village in Japan 18 months and I conducted in-depth observations and interviews to explore how and why young people are creating their own eco subculture. Additionally, I conducted two months of intensive fieldwork in Thailand studying the same phenomenon. I am now comparing the emerging patterns of healthful living and environmental consciousness in Japan and Thailand. My research will determine how these political-economic changes shape trends within each country, and relations between the two societies. This study will contribute to improvements in health and the environment.

Long-term ongoing research interest

“Thai Community Wellness Study”

This ongoing research is designed to explain what causes Thais to develop habits that influence their health. Thailand is a predominantly Buddhist society that, like many rapidly modernizing

societies, now faces an increasing burden of “habit-borne” diseases such as heart disease, cancer, diabetes, and depression. My research has shown that modernization and sophisticated marketing strategies have influence Thai cultural patterns, values, habits, and the biophysical environment. Ongoing fieldwork indicates that working-class Thais continue to find themselves living life out of balance, adopting poor health habits, and feeling burdened by stress and anxiety. These factors contribute substantially to tobacco use among poor and working-class Thais. The findings from this research suggest that Thais would benefit from a Buddhist approach to health promotion that shows a path for living a healthful life.
